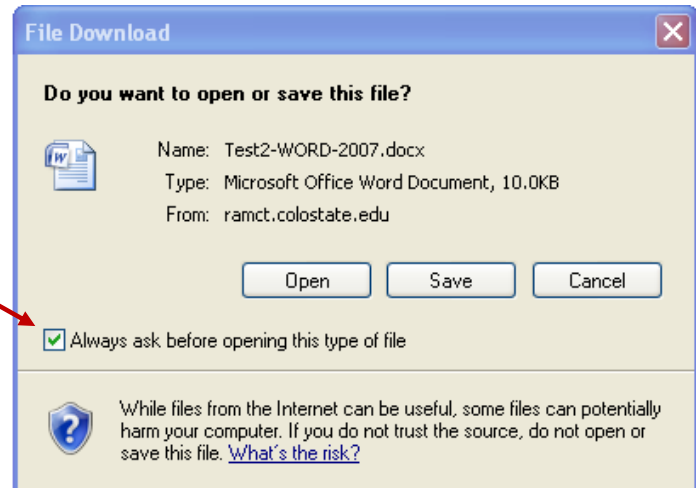


Reset File Download Prompt Setting for Internet Explorer in Windows XP & 2000

The File Download prompt in Internet Explorer (IE7 or IE6 or older) offers you the option to Open or Save a file.

If the check box of “Always ask before opening this type of file” is un-ticked, you will no longer see the File Download prompt again for that file type; rather the file will be opened automatically without offering the Save option.

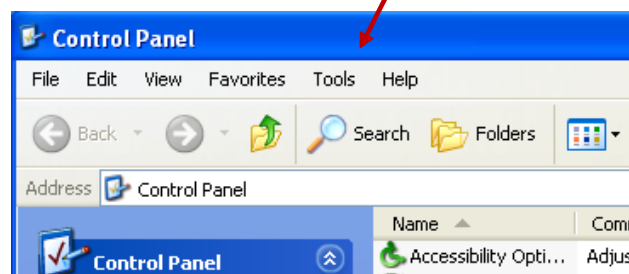


If you wish to have the File Download prompt appear again in **Windows XP & 2000** follow the steps below. To reset the setting for **Windows Vista** requires a registry edit; see your [college/area RamCT Coordinator](#).

Steps to reset the File Download prompt in Windows XP & 2000:

Note: You need Administrator or Power User privileges to reset this function.

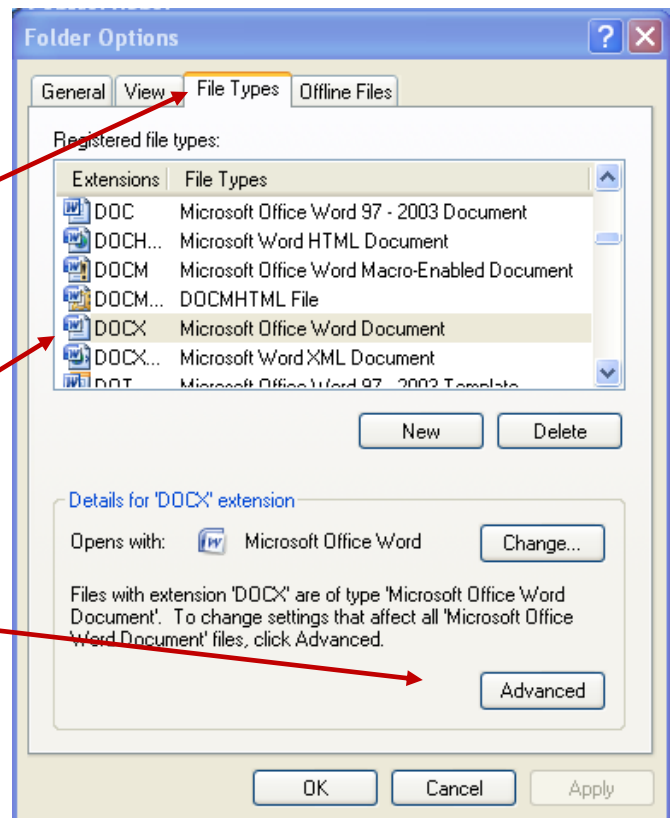
1. Close **ALL** Internet Explorer windows, including Windows Explorer.
2. Open Start/Control Panel, and then click on **Tools** in the menu bar, then **Folder Options** in the drop down menu.



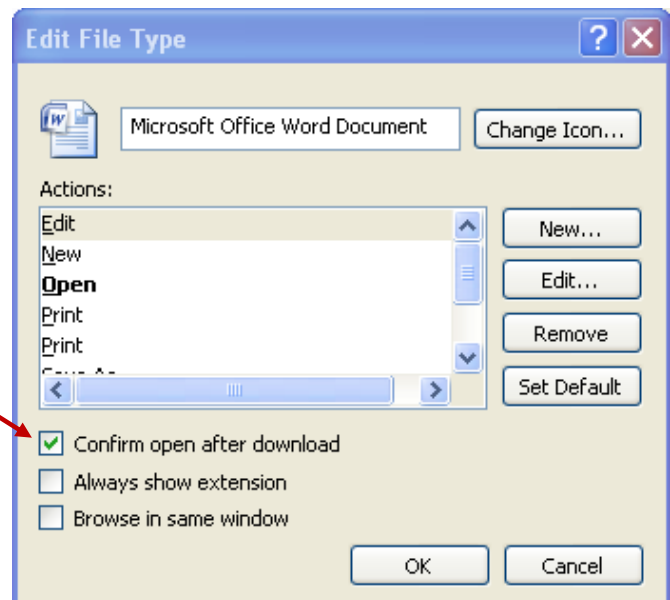
3. In the Folder Options dialog, select **File Types** tab. This tab lists every file type associated with Windows.

4. Locate and select the file type or extension that you want to reset.

5. Click on the **Advanced** button.



6. In the Edit File Type window, untick and then re-tick the **Confirm open after download** check box.



7. Click **OK** and close.

After opening a new IE window and clicking a link to a file, you will be given the File Download prompt again with the options to Open or Save.
